POSTGRADUATE SPECIALIST COURSES - 3RD LEVEL

Two-year courses for candidates with a second level degree in music, recognized by the Ministry for University (3 points in public competitions). Our teachers, renowned as some of the foremost soloists in the world, adopt innovative teaching methods.

ADVANCED MUSIC COURSES

One/two/three-year tailor-made courses, taught by musicians of international fame and aimed at extending and deepening students' knowledge of repertoire, in preparation for a professional career. Shorter Light courses and masterclasses complete our educational offer.



OUR INTERNATIONAL OUTLOOK

Since its inception, the Academy has developed an important international dimension, as we involved teachers and students from all over the world. This has been consolidated through the International Chamber Music Competition Pinerolo e Torino Città metropolitana, a competition which is part of the WFIMC (UNESCO) and enables performances from some of the best young musicians on the international scene.

Today the Accademia aspires to extend its **network of relationships** with European and international bodies, working on common goals such as student mobility, research and **innovation** in music.







PERFORMANCE-ORIENTED COMPOSITION COURSE

A NEW ADVANCED COURSES

THE TRADITIONAL TRAINING OF COMPOSERS

The traditional training of composers, widespread in conservatories and academies, is devised to create scores, i.e. written documents, subsequently entrusted to the interpreters for their performance. According to such established practice, the composer's work ends when the score takes on its final draft, and from there on, the interpreter's work begins. Such division of roles reflects theoretical approaches that were in force in academic contexts in the past but contradicts the historical practice of composition and its nature. Indeed, no composer was ever alien to the performative process, and, recently, composers have become more often involved in the performance of their music.

A NEW PERFORMANCE-ORIENTED COMPOSITION CLASS

The Fondazione Accademia di Musica aims to fill this gap with an innovative and unique proposal: a performance-oriented composition course devised by Francesco Antonioni. The performance-oriented composition course addresses the creative skills of composers towards the performance, through the direct and effective involvement of the composer in the executive act, as conductor or composer-performer.





STUDY PATHWAY

The Performance-Oriented Composition scheme is an innovative and groundbreaking programme that integrates Composition and Conducting. It aims to combine the expertise of composers with the sensitivity of performers and addresses the Composition towards its practical fulfilment in performance. Filling a gap in the current education pathways that bind the practice of Composition within the completion of a score, the Performance-Oriented-Composition scheme is a unique opportunity to develop compositional skills along with conductor training. It encourages the blossoming of contemporary practices that blend musical imagination with adventurous performances.

ACADEMIC YEAR 2024/24

One-to-one tuition in Composition will be provided by Francesco Antonioni (IT), coordinator of the project, with seminars and workshops given by guest composers and composer-performers: Richard Baker (UK); Kate Soper (USA); Francesca Verunelli (IT); Jörg Widmann (DE); Oscar Bianchi (IT). The students will rehearse with the resident ensemble under the supervision of Alessandro Cadario (IT).

From January 2025 will be provided:

- 8 one-hour individual Composition lessons
- 5 two-hour seminars or workshops with guest composers or composerperformers
- 5 five-hour individual Conducting lessons
- · 3 days rehearsals with chamber ensemble
- · Final concert

Lessons will take place with monthly cadence, on Saturdays and Sundays. The languages of the course are Italian and English.
